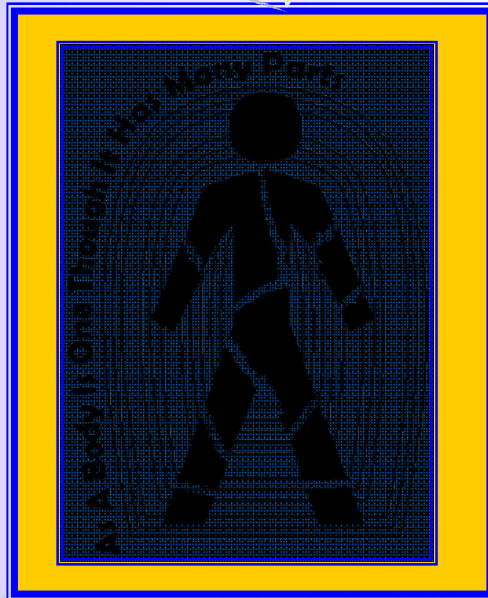

One Sunday, as I waited in line to receive the Body and Blood of Our Lord, I felt the Lord say to me, "Look around at all the people in this church. Each person here has a small, yet unique piece of Me within them. Yet all the people of the world put together, with all their unique pieces would produce only a partial picture of who I AM. I AM so expansive, you could not even comprehend." God tells us in Isaiah 55: 8-9, "*For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways,*" declares the Lord. "*As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts.*" Even though He is so far above us God loves us so much that He created us in His image and likeness. *Then God said: "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. Let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and the cattle, and over all the wild animals and all the creatures that crawl on the ground." God created man in His image; in the divine image He created him; male and female he created them (Genesis 1: 26-27).*

God loves us so much that he sent His only begotten Son to die in our place for our sins, He gave us the Holy Spirit to guide us, the sacraments as special graces to help us on our journey to holiness and the charisms to build up the Body of Christ, the Church. Yet, it seems with all the graces God's given us, many in the Body of Christ are still confused about who they really are; children of God created in his divine image to know Him, love Him, and serve Him. They've allowed the enemy of their souls to rob them of their identity and uniqueness in Christ Jesus, but I'm here to say that the enemy is a liar and a thief.

Our God has made us all unique and loves us individually, but He's also made us to fit together for the greater glory of His Kingdom. Where one is weak in an area, he's made another of us strong. Where one is a prophet, he's made another a healer. Where one is a leader, he's made another one to follow. There is no great honor or dishonor in any of these roles. You with the gift of prophesy, don't shun your gift because you wish you were given the gift of healing. Instead, pray to grow in your gift and ask the Lord to give you the gift of healing. Again St. Paul reminds us through his analogy of the body, in 1 Corinthians 12: 12-26 that there is one body made up of many parts, meant to work together and "*if (one) part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy.*"

When we are baptized in the Holy Spirit, we are meant to grow in the gifts of the Holy Spirit. God always desires to give us more. If we remain dormant in a single gift of the Spirit, we need to seek God to pour out more into our lives and ministries. When we ask God to increase our gifts, it is imperative that we step out and exercise these gifts in faith to overcome the spirits of fear, doubt, and disbelief. St. Paul, in 2 Timothy 1: 6-8, exhorts us to fan into flame the gift of God that we have through the imposition of hands, for God did not give us a spirit of fear, but of power, love, and self control. If fear comes upon us, we must ask the Holy Spirit to reveal the source of the fear so that we may overcome this destructive spirit and be free to operate in the Spirit of the Lord. Proverbs 11:9 tells us that through knowledge we will be delivered. I say this is the day we must make a choice to believe in the gifts that God has given us and step out in faith to pray for someone's healing or pass along a prophetic word. God will honor our faith and obedience.

Many have received the gift of tongues, but don't use the gift because the enemy has convinced them that it sounds silly or he puts doubt in their minds that they are saying anything at all. This is the spirits of pride and doubt at work and we must repent, then use our gift in faith. As St. Paul says, "*For he who speaks in a tongue does not speak to men but to God, for no one understands him; however, in the spirit he speaks mysteries.*" (1 Corinthians 14:2) St. Paul also says in 1 Corinthians 14:4 that whoever speaks in tongues builds himself up. Building yourself up also builds up the Church.

So brothers and sisters, realize that each one of you is a one of a kind creation of God, Who put you on this Earth at this time, in this place, for a specific purpose. He's made you in His likeness and image and He wants you to be salt and light in this world. He's given you everything you need to do His will. *For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them (Ephesians 2:10).*

"In my Father's house there are many dwelling places."

I had always wondered why it was that God has his preferences, instead of giving each soul an equal degree of grace... Jesus has been gracious enough to teach me a lesson about this mystery, simply by holding up to my eyes the book of nature. I realized, then, that all the flowers he has made are beautiful; the rose in its glory, the lily in its whiteness, don't rob the tiny violet of its sweet smell, or the daisy of its charming simplicity. I saw that if all these lesser blooms wanted to be roses instead, nature would lose the gaiety of her spring tide dress-there would be no little flowers to, make a pattern over the countryside.

And so it is with the world of souls, which is his garden. He wanted to have great Saints, to be his lilies and roses, but he has made lesser Saints as well; and these lesser ones must be content to rank as daisies and violets, lying at his feet and giving pleasure to his eye like that. Perfection consists simply in doing his will, and being just what he wants us to be. This, too, was made clear to me: that our Lord's love makes itself seen quite as much in the simplest of souls as in the most highly gifted, as long as there is no resistance offered to his grace. After all, the whole point of love is making yourself small; and if we were all like the great Doctors who have shed luster on the Church by their brilliant teaching, there wouldn't be much condescension on God's part, would there, about coming into hearts like these? But no, he has created little children, who have no idea what's going on and can only express themselves by helpless crying: he has made the poor savages, with nothing better than the natural law to live by; and he is content to forget his dignity and come into their hearts too - these are the wild flowers that delight him by their simplicity. It is by such condescension that God shows his infinite greatness. The sun's light that plays on the cedar-trees plays on each tiny flower as if it were the only one in existence; and in the same way our Lord takes a special interest in each soul, as if there were no other like it.

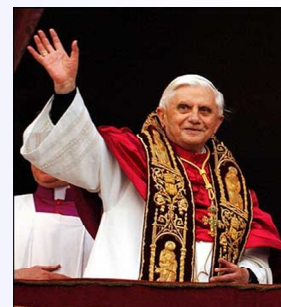

“What sounds full of hope throughout the universal Church, and this even in the midst of the crisis that the Church is going through in the Western world, is the upsurge of new movements that no one has planned and no one called into being...what is becoming apparent in them...is something akin to a Pentecostal hour in the Church. I am thinking for instance of the Charismatic Renewal movement (*and then names others*).”

“Go out to meet with much love the movements and new communities; let us make an effort to know their reality adequately, without superficial impressions or reductive judgments...They are a gift of the Lord, a precious resource to enrich our whole Christian community with their charisms.” (Words given to a gathering of 150 bishops attending a seminar on ecclesial movements in 2008.)

Catechism of the Catholic Church .. Charisms, a Means to Build Up the Church

799 Whether extraordinary or simple and humble, charisms are graces of the Holy Spirit which directly or indirectly benefit the Church, ordered as they are to her building up, to the good of men, and to the needs of the world.

800 Charisms are to be accepted with gratitude by the person who receives them and by all members of the Church as well. They are a wonderfully rich grace for the apostolic vitality and for the holiness of the entire Body of Christ, provided they really are genuine gifts of the Holy Spirit and are used in full conformity with authentic promptings of this same Spirit, that is, in keeping with charity, the true measure of all charisms.

801 It is in this sense that discernment of charisms is always necessary. No charism is exempt from being referred and submitted to the Church’s shepherds. “Their office (is) not indeed to extinguish the Spirit, but to test all things and hold fast to what is good,” so that all the diverse and complementary charisms work together “for the common good.”

Questions to ICCRS

In St. Paul's 1st letter to the Corinthians 12: 8-11, he says that specific gifts are given to various people such as healing, prophecy or tongues. Does this mean that if I have the gift of tongues I should not expect to have another gift?

This is a common misunderstanding of 1 Cor. 12. What St. Paul is referring to, is that the Holy Spirit will give a particular gift to an individual as a ministry. We see individual Christians who are consistently used in a ministry such as healing, prophecy, teaching with wisdom or other charisms.

But St. Paul himself in 1 Cor. 14 encourages, that all should desire the gift of prophecy. He desires that all should speak in tongues. When we receive the Holy Spirit and manifest the gifts, the Spirit can choose anyone he pleases to manifest healing, prophecy, discernment of spirits, interpretation of tongues or any one of the extraordinary gifts. So be open and willing to be used by God the Holy Spirit with any gift and at any time and also to ask the Holy Spirit to develop the ministry that he desires to see in your life.

A friend who was once active in the CCR now tells me that they have moved on and outgrown the charismatic renewal and are now into contemplation. I did not know how to respond and is it true that contemplation is better than the Charismatic Renewal?

It is not a question of either or, as though one form of prayer is more advanced than another. The charisms are inseparable from our life in Christ as they are tools given by God the Holy Spirit to build up the body. One does not outgrow the Holy Spirit. Your friend may feel drawn to contemplative prayer but this in no way excludes the activity of the Holy Spirit.

The danger is that one can fall into the trap of elitism, feeling superior to others as the Pharisee did in the Lord's parable of the Pharisee and the poor sinner.

There are times for everyone of us to enter deeply into contemplative prayer and also times when we are vocal and use the gifts God has given to us for his body. I have heard of tongues being compared to vocal contemplation, as when we pray in the Spirit it is without conscious thought and therefore contemplative in its nature.

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me.



According to Fr. Bob Hogan, during his talk "Restoration of Person, Families and Relationships" on Sept. 18th at Holy Spirit Church, we should start each day by asking Jesus to help us carry our cross and for the grace to die to self and the things that aren't good in our lives. He said we should also invite the Holy Spirit to guide us in everything we do that day.
