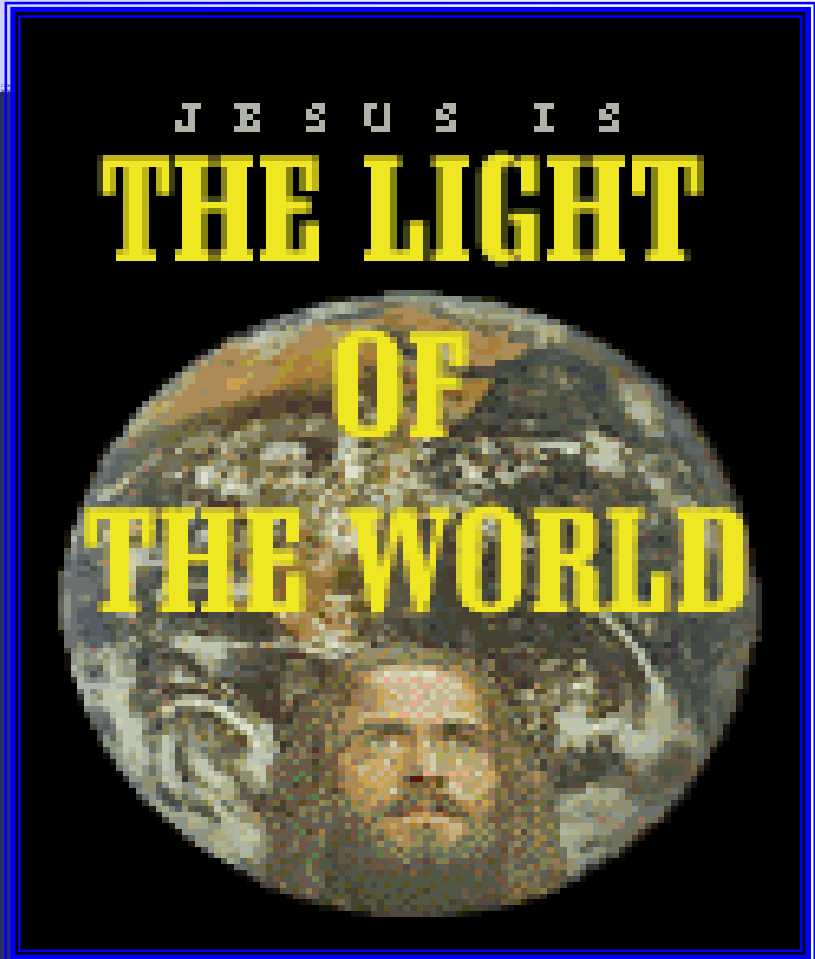

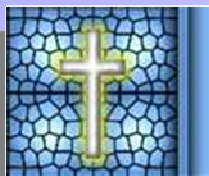

Power Tools for Evangelization

In order for us to get the job done, the Lord has furnished us with basic and powerful tools that are readily available to us. This list is by no means exhaustive, but I believe they are necessary elements in the works of evangelization. These are:

1. The presence of the Holy Spirit
2. The intercession of Mary, the mother of God and the mother of the mystical body of Christ
3. The use of charismatic gifts of the Holy Spirit
4. Prayer

The Presence of the Holy Spirit

Before ascending into heaven, Jesus told his disciples; “But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” (Acts 1:8) At Pentecost, when the disciples received the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, they received power, the same power that raised Jesus from the dead. Consequently, they were transformed into fearless and powerful evangelizers. The baptism of the Holy Spirit enabled them to walk in the spiritual realm where they were led by the Spirit, controlled by the Spirit, filled by the Spirit and guided by the Spirit. They were able to do the works of Jesus such as raising the dead to life, making the blind see, the lame walk, the deaf hear and setting free those who were oppressed by the devil. In John 14:12, Jesus says, “Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father.”

In his encyclical, *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, Pope Paul VI states that “evangelization will never be possible without the action of the Holy Spirit.” He further states: “It is the Holy Spirit who, today just as at the beginning of the Church, acts in every evangelizer who allows himself to be possessed and led by Him. The Holy Spirit places on his lips the words which he could not find by himself, and at the same time, the Holy Spirit predisposes the soul of the hearer to be open and receptive to the Good News and to the Kingdom being proclaimed.” (EN 75) invoking the Holy Spirit to empower us so that we will become effective soul winners for God’s Kingdom should be every Christian’s priority.

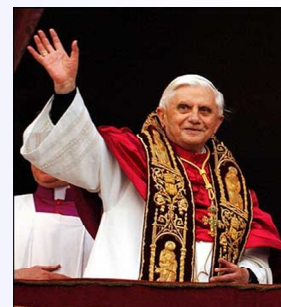

Catechism of the Catholic Church .. We are children of Light!

1695 "Justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God," "sanctified . . . [and] called to be saints," Christians have become the temple of the *Holy Spirit*. This "Spirit of the Son" teaches them to pray to the Father and, having become their life, prompts them to act so as to bear "the fruit of the Spirit" by charity in action. Healing the wounds of sin, the Holy Spirit renews us interiorly through a spiritual transformation. He enlightens and strengthens us to live as "children of light" through "all that is good and right and true."

52 God, who "dwells in unapproachable light", wants to communicate his own divine life to the men he freely created, in order to adopt them as his sons in his only-begotten Son. By revealing himself God wishes to make them capable of responding to him, and of knowing him and of loving him far beyond their own natural capacity.

2105 The duty of offering God genuine worship concerns man both individually and socially. This is "the traditional Catholic teaching on the moral duty of individuals and societies toward the true religion and the one Church of Christ." By constantly evangelizing men, the Church works toward enabling them "to infuse the Christian spirit into the mentality and mores, laws and structures of the communities in which [they] live." The social duty of Christians is to respect and awaken in each man the love of the true and the good. It requires them to make known the worship of the one true religion which subsists in the Catholic and apostolic Church. Christians are called to be the light of the world. Thus, the Church shows forth the kingship of Christ over all creation and in particular over human societies.

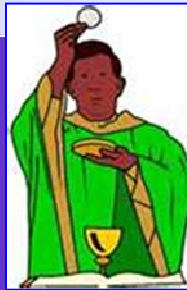

The Intercession of Mary (continued from p. 3)

Mary, the mediatrix of all graces, the spouse of the Holy Spirit, is an evangelizer par excellence. In the CCC, 973, we find these words: “By pronouncing her ‘fiat’ at the Annunciation and giving her consent to the Incarnation, Mary was already collaborating with the whole work her Son was to accomplish. She is the mother wherever He is savior and head of the Mystical Body. Her ‘Yes’ to the Lord and her faith and trust in Him make her a model evangelizer. When they ran short of wine during the wedding feast at Cana, Mary told the servers to “do whatever he tells you to do.” (Jn 2:3) In order for us to become powerful proclaimers of the gospel, we should take to heart her instructions; to be obedient to Jesus by doing what he tells us to do. It is also wise for us to invoke her intercession for us to accomplish the tasks that the Lord has assigned us to do. After all, she is our “mother” and she is “full of grace.” The CCC 968, states: “Her role in relation to the Church and to all humanity goes still further. In a wholly singular way she cooperated by her obedience, faith, hope and burning charity in the Savior’s work of restoring supernatural life to souls. For this reason, she is a mother to us in the order of grace.”

The Charismatic Gifts

St. Paul describes the following charismatic gifts as mentioned in 1 Cor. 12:8-10, the word of wisdom, the word of knowledge, faith, healing miracles, prophecy, discernment of spirits, tongues, and interpretation of tongues. These gifts are the ingredients for a powerful and effective work of evangelization. The CCC 798 states that “Charisms are special graces, by which the Holy Spirit makes the faithful fit and ready to undertake various tasks and offices for the renewal and building up of the Church.” The charisms are not just “natural abilities” but gifts given by the Holy Spirit to each person as he wills. There are other lists of gifts mentioned in Eph 4, Rom 12, and 1 Peter 4. Surely, the charisms or spiritual gifts manifest the transcendence of God. In Healing Crusades in Thailand and Malaysia not too long ago, which I had the privilege to conduct, the manifestations of the gifts of the Holy Spirit such as, word of knowledge, prophecy, healings miracles, tongues, and words of wisdom were very visible. Some people walked from wheelchairs, deaf people were able to hear, tumors and abnormal growths disappeared, some blind people regained their sight and other healings such as emotional and spiritual healings took place. Afterwards, some non-Christians came up to us asking to be baptized as Roman Catholics because they had witnessed the power and presence of Jesus in their midst. They came to believe in the preaching that Jesus is true God and true man who died for our sins, who rose from the dead and is now seated at the right hand of God and to believe that Jesus is the healer and that he is still healing now.

These spiritual gifts are not only applicable during Healing Crusades or Healing Services or prayer meetings, but they can also be used in the market place, in the work place, at home or wherever there are human interactions. The second Vatican Council document on the Decree of the Apostolate of Lay People 3 asserts: “From the reception of these charisms, even the most ordinary ones, there arises in each of the faithful the right and the duty of exercising them in the Church and in the world for the good of men and the development of the Church; of exercising the freedom of the Holy Spirit who “breathes where he wills.”

Prayer

What is prayer? Prayer is the raising of one’s mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God, according to the CCC. Prayer is the key that opens the door to God’s power. Matt 7:8-11, Jesus says, “For everyone who asks, receives, and the one who seeks, finds, and for the one who knocks, the door will be opened.” Then call on me in time of distress, I will rescue you and you will honor me.” (Ps 50:15)

One of the most powerful weapons to use for evangelization is prayer. Prayer can bring down the power of the evil one and is a vehicle for a victorious Christian life. “They that hope in the Lord will renew their strength, they will soar as with eagles’ wings; they will run and not grow weary, walk and not grow faint.” (Is 40:31)

Prayers should not only be directed to the Lord for our own personal needs but also for those who don’t know the Lord. St. Paul, in Eph 6:18-19, writes: “With all prayer and supplication, pray at every opportunity in the Spirit. To that end, be watchful with all perseverance and supplication for all the holy ones.” I will never forget the experience I had one day when I was interviewed live on a Christian TV program in the San Francisco Bay area. I was interviewed regarding the ministry of healing and deliverance and the interviewer asked me to pray for the viewers live. Without hesitation, I prayed in tongues and I invoked the Holy Spirit to manifest His presence. Then I started to receive words of knowledge on healings and prophecies for certain individuals who were watching the program. I also took the opportunity to pray for the baptism of the Holy Spirit. At the conclusion of the program, many viewers called the TV station to report healings that they had experienced and to confirm prophecies given.

But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what he has done has been done through God. John 3:21
